Greetings Coalition Family!

I was recently asked, again, what my position is on reparations for the descendents of African captives forced into chattel slavery.

First, I would like a clear definition of reparations. Webster's defines reparations as an act to repair, restore or compensate for a wrong or injury, payable in monies, goods or services. Most, when thinking of reparations think of monies being paid out to survivors, and indeed that can be part of it. But, if you seek to *repair*, then you must assess the damages done. The damage done to the captives was diverse; they had their culture, wealth, families, ancestry, humanity and even their God taken from them.

How do you begin to repair that kind of damage?

How do you give a person back their name after being cut off from their family for nearly five hundred years? Hmmm, should all people of African decent in the western hemisphere be afforded free DNA testing? And then all the inhabitants of western Africa be typed to match? How do you *repair* the damage done to the black family structure that necessitates that women assume the role of both parents, and the men aspire to be adolescent pimps? How do you teach a nation about their God when you yourself have no real perception of who God is?

What can you do to *restore* the dignity and humanity so effectively suppressed and sometimes destroyed in the captives? What can be done to *restore* the American-born African male his sense of manhood?

How do you *compensate* African mothers and fathers, sisters and brothers for the agony of never seeing their loved ones again? How do you *compensate* american-born Africans for the theft of the opportunity to live in and develop an unmolested continent, the richest continent on the planet?

I venture that most groups involved in the quest for reparations have not attempted to address the problems of re-associating us with our families, culture and vital ancestry. We must consider how to disassociate from a culture that has infused us with greed, immorality and violence. We must consider that in order for us to be restored to our former status in the world and with each other, the black man must relearn what it means to be a man in his own village. We must demand compensation for the rape and losses to the motherland of valuable natural and human resources, for all we have contributed to these invading societies is the natural property of mother Africa, and she should be compensated. Why do people say 'God Bless You' when you sneeze?

There are several theories for this.

One theory says that the phrase "God Bless you" came from an Islamic practice which originated over 1400 years ago. According to the Islam religion, when someone sneezed, he should say "All Praises to God" and in response the people would reply "May God Bless You".

Another explanation is that when people sneezed it was believed that the heart would miss a beat; in that microsecond, the skip would allow the devil to enter the body. Therefore, saying "God bless you" would stop the devil from entering one's body uninvited.

Another middle ages superstition held that, when one sneezed, a large amount of breath (regarded as the very breath of life) could be expelled suddenly from the body, resulting in death. In case the victim died in this instance, he/she would at least go to heaven with God's Blessing.

Written records state that the saying goes back to the time of Pope Saint Gregory I, or Gregory the Great, who was Pope of the Catholic Church from September 590 until he died in 604. When Pope Gregory ascended to the Papacy, it was just in time for the start of the Plague, so this Pope is unfortunately known as the patron saint of plague. On 16 February 590 A.D., Pope Gregory decreed that whenever someone sneezed, others should say "God bless you" in response. - 1. Change to Fluorescent Bulbs If every house in the United States changed all of the light bulbs in their house, that would be equivalent to taking one million cars off the streets.
 - 2. <u>Don't Rinse</u> Skip rinsing your plates before putting them into the dishwasher. In average you will save 15 gallons of water per load. Plus, you will save time.
 - 3. <u>Hang Outside to Dry</u> Get a cloths line or rack to <u>dry</u> your cloths. Your cloths will last longer and you will save money
- 4. Turn off computers at night don't just put them to sleep. You will save an average of 4 cents a day which ads up to \$14.60 a year.

- 9. Shorten your shower Every minute you cut from your shower is roughly 5 gallons of water. The less time your shower takes, the lower your impact on the environment.

Mothers United Through Tragedy, Inc.

MUTT Inc. are Mothers, Fathers, Grandparents and Family Members who's lives have changed due to murder. Each one with a tragic story of how their loved one was murdered. Each person struggling to cope with the loss. MUTT Inc. is a Citywide organization. Survivors coming together to heal and take a stand to denounce the senseless violence that is plaguing our City.

The City of Philadelphia and the nation as a whole, struggles with the fall-out crime victimization causes. Victims of crime and their loved ones are frequently faced with financial, physical and even psychological loss after crime. Very often they believe they have been neglected by the judicial system that protects the rights of the accused. It is against this background that there is a need for continued services for victims of crime and for an organization like MUTT Inc.

The mission of Mothers United Through Tragedy Inc. is to assist parents and family members in the positive resolution of grief following the death of a child and to provide information to help others be supportive after the murder of a child or loved one. I started this organization after the murder of my first born identical twin son. It was the only way that I could cope with the loss of my first born, caused by a person who had little regard for human life. He became my child's Judge, Jury and Executioner. And in doing this I felt I had to do something other than wanting to kill that person myself. "AN EYE FOR AN EYE". But that is not the way, Vengence is the mine sayeth the Lord. THOU SHALL NOT KILL.....So in helping other parents and family members work through their pain, grief and sorrows, my sons spirit lives on thru me.

Group offers low-cost web access to nonprofits

All entries for submission should be received by noon, the Monday prior to publish date and in Press Release form.

Q: Are these manufacturer coupons or coupons that I print on my computer?

A: All of our coupons are actual manufacturer coupons. Fewer and fewer retailers accept coupons that are printed from your computer because of a huge increase in counterfeit coupons. Actual manufacturer coupons which we issue are accepted everywhere that coupons are accepted.

Q: Can these coupons be doubled?

A: Yes. These are manufacturer issued coupons and may be doubled in any store that offers double coupons.

Q: What are the face values and the expiration dates of these coupons? A: Being manufacturer coupons, the manufacturer determines the face values of the coupons. We currently stock coupons ranging in value from 40 cents to 5.00 dollars. The coupon expiration dates are generally valid for 90 days.

Q: How can I use \$1,000.00 worth of coupons in 90 days?

A: With our program, you get to choose the coupons you want, when you want them. This way you never have to worry about the coupons expiring.

Q: How do I choose the coupons I want?
